






## Appendix 1 NYC Signalling Flags, 2017

1. Class flags: Dinghies: (Delta) 






AN Others: (Lima) 

The meanings of visual and sound signals are stated below. An arrow pointing up or down (↑ or ↓) means that a visual signal is displayed or removed. A dot (•) means a short sound, a long dash (—) means a long sound.

### 2. Start sequence:

Time	Signal	Flag	Sound
5 min	Warning	 ↑	•
4 min	Prep	 ↑	•
1 min	One min	 ↓	—
Start	Start	 ↓	•

### 3. Other signals:

Signal	Flag	Sound	Notes
Postponement		↑ .. ↓ •	Races not started are <i>postponed</i> . The warning signal will be made 1 minute after removal unless at that time the race is <i>postponed</i> again or <i>abandoned</i> .
Individual Recall		↑ • ↓	The flag shall be displayed until all such boats have sailed completely to the pre-start side of the starting line but no later than four minutes after the starting signal
General Recall		↑ .. ↓ •	If unable to identify boats that are on the course side of the starting line or there has been an error in the starting procedure, the race committee may signal a general recall. The warning signal for a new start for the recalled class shall be made one minute after flag removed
Shortened Course		↑ ..	The finishing line shall be: (a) At a rounding <i>mark</i> , between the <i>mark</i> and a staff displaying flag S; (b) A line the course requires boats to cross (c) At a gate, between the gate <i>marks</i>  The shortened course shall be signalled before the first boat crosses the finishing line
Abandon		↑ ...	
Finish		•	Where possible but not necessary
